# <u>Path 2 - ISUGA Program 3rd year</u>

- Your major is International business, Management, or Economics
- Your level in English is TOEIC 600 minimum

#### **Apply for ISUGA Program 3rd year**

#### ISUGA Program (3rd year) - Main features:

#### Calendar: September to mid-March

Please note that:

- If you stay from September to December you will not complete all the courses
- To validate the school diploma, you may do a two-month internship (in France or abroad), or switch to Path 1 (Europe program) or write a final report to wrap up your academic year
- To validate the French recognized diploma Bachelor in Business Development Manager International specialization, a two-month internship is mandatory (oral presentation of your internship report in September).

#### **Content:**

- Marketing, Logistics, Administrative and financial follow-up in international business actions, Markets and clients, Prospection plans, Management, International contracts, Doing business with Asian countries, etc.
- Courses are taught in English except Accounting.
- Learn French from beginner level

# Study together with French students and get an intercultural insight of international business

Note that to apply for the Master International Business Development Manager (ISUGA Program 4th and 5th years), students need to have at least TOEIC 750 + to hold a Bachelor in International Business.

# ISUGA Program (1st year) - Main features:

**Calendar:** September to mid-February

Please note that:

- If you stay from September to December: you will not complete all the courses
- If you stay from September to April: you may switch to Path 1 in March and April to wrap up your academic year.

#### Content:

- French courses
- A diversity of courses taught in French: International business techniques, Marketing, Contemporary history, Press review, Status and organization of the company, French, Accounting, Sales, Asian countries cultures, Business English, etc.

# PREPARE YOUR BUDGET

The estimated costs in Quimper:

Expenses	Approximative amounts	Remarks
Accomodation	From 350€ to 650€ per month	Inclusive of water, electricity, wifi Exclusive of « APL allocation », between 100 & 150 € per month to be deducted (note: during 1st month, no APL is applicable)
House insurance	50€ per year	Mandatory
Complementary health insurance: « mutuelle »	Approx.100 € per year according to selected options	Elective but strongly recommended, to be paid upon arrival in France
French Residence card	50€ per year	Mandatory, to be paid upon arrival in France
Public bus transportation card	25€ per month	Convenient, to be paid each month
Telephone	10 to 20€ per month	Convenient, to be paid each month
Food, laundry, cleaning	Approx. 300€ per month	Monthly expenses

# COMING TO OUIMPER

#### Your arrival

To come to Quimper, we advise you to land in Paris CDG Airport, and then to take a train to Quimper Station.

If you prefer, you may take a flight from Paris to Brest and then get a train from Brest to Quimper.

# General transport information



Closest airports : Brest, Rennes or Nantes



The national French train network is SNCF. To book a train ticket, visit <a href="https://www.sncf-connect.com/">https://www.sncf-connect.com/</a>



- With Flixbus you may travel by coach in France and Europe
- In Quimper, the city bus network is called <u>QUB</u>.
- And, to visit the surroundings of Quimper, the coach company <u>BreizhGo</u> offers a regular bus service.



In Quimper you can rent a bike for 3 or 6 months through <u>Vélo QUB</u>, a city rental service.







# **USEFUL TIPS**



If you need to change money in Euros, go to a foreign exchange counter in Paris as there isn't any in Quimper.

Temperatures in Quimper are generally mild. It is rather windy and damp in Automn and Winter, and the weather changes very often. Bring a raincoat, umbrella and shoes that can withstand rainy days as well as regular clothes.





You should always keep your ID card with you as it is mandatory in France. We advise you to keep a scanned copy of your ID card and your passport.
